Throughout history, India–Japan relations have always been strong. Indian culture, filtered through Buddhism, has had a great impact on Japanese culture, and this is the source of the Japanese people's sense of closeness to India.

#### about Odisha

Odisha, is a state of India, located on the east coast of India, by the Bay of Bengal. Odisha is the 9th largest state by area in India, and the 11th largest by population.

Odisha imbibed the quintessence of cultural traditions of both Northern India and Southern India, yet it succeeded in developing a distinct identity of its own in the realms of creative arts. The cultural heritage of Odisha is one of the oldest, embracing a period of about three thousand years.









The Odisha Biennale will be launched in 2013 by MUDRA FOUNDATION as a global convocation of visual/performing artists with all their diversity (MUDRA FOUNDATION, a non-profit-organization started in 2009 with the aim of sharing art and creativity with underprivileged people by Masako Ono who has been living in India for the last 16 years as an Odissi/contemporary dancer.)

Odisha Biennale 2013 presents a 1 week exhibition, a program of artist talks, performances, workshops, film screenings, guided tours and other special events.



#### The purpose and meaning

To bring together tribal, folk, classical and contemporary art forms and artists from all over the world under one roof and develop and present a program/exhibition that challenges traditional thinking and encourages new levels of enthusiasm for innovative creative expression.

To build the link between creative practice and social development, and the link between the local and global contexts. The workshop by artists would be held in underprivileged communities as well. Our programs promote the exchange of art and ideas through workshops, staging, and exhibiting arts and work globally and locally, bringing together an international vision of art and cross-cultural exchange with a commitment to the community involvement and the enrichment of ODISHA's cultural resources.

To promote ODISHA to be recognized as a cultural hub city that holds the prestigious international "Art/Dance Biennale - Odisha Biennale ".

Masako Ono, the only Japanese Odissi dancer, is an empanelled Artist of ICCR, Govt. of India. She has been selected as one of the 100 most respected Japanese in the world by the Newsweek Japan in 2008. From 2009, she launched "MUDRA foundation" in order to support the activity of international artists help the underprivileged and special need society in India.
